About the Role

This is a volunteer unpaid role.

The Assurance Committee meets at least three times per year. Members serve a two-year term (renewable once for a further 2 years) and must be current members of the Nuclear Institute. The committee's remit includes (but not exclusive to):

- Approving the Institute's annual financial statements and accounts
- Providing assurance to the Board that there is a suitable mechanism in place for budget setting for each financial year
- Advising on external and internal audit matters
- Overseeing the Institute's risk management and control environment
- Providing assurance on governance practices and key internal policies

You'll be joining a knowledgeable, supportive committee and helping to ensure the Nuclear Institute operates transparently, accountably, and effectively in the public interest.

Who Should Apply?

We are looking for members who can demonstrate experience or expertise in at least two of the following areas:

- Financial reporting or accounting (professional accountancy qualification an advantage)
- Risk management
- Internal or external audit
- Governance (corporate, charity, or regulatory)

Committee experience is welcome but not essential. Training and support will be provided.
