

Join the Editorial Committee for Nuclear Future, the NI's journal and magazine.

The NI is seeking to appoint a new Chair and members to its **Nuclear Future Editorial Committee**. This is an excellent opportunity for NI members to contribute to the strategic direction and content of what is a key member benefit and to contribute to knowledge sharing within the NI community.

About the Committee

The Editorial Committee meets four times per year, normally with 1-2 of these meetings in-person. Members serve a three-year term (renewable once) and must be current members of the Institute. The committee's remit includes:

- Guiding the overall strategy and direction of *Nuclear Future*.
- Assisting the Technical Editor in specific tasks relating to the refereeing of papers submitted to the NI for publication in the Journal section of *Nuclear Future*.
- Helping to raise the profile of Nuclear Future amongst learned journals through the publication of high quality scientific and engineering papers.
- Providing guidance to the Editor/Publisher on nuclear related topics for publication in the non-technical content of Nuclear Future.
- Providing advice, suggestions and contacts for emerging themes and issues that may be relevant to the nuclear industry.

Available roles

Editorial Committee Chair

The Chair is the Honorary Editor of Nuclear Future and is appointed by the NI Nominations Committee. The Chair's primary functions are to manage Committee meetings, steer the strategic direction and agree the content of *Nuclear Future*. The Chair has the ultimate responsibility for determining the technical content of *Journal* and approval of the Pinkerton Prize winner for best technical paper.

Committee Member

The Committee member's primary role is to contribute to the strategic direction and advise on the content of *Nuclear Future* publications. Committee Members, where appropriate, act as specialist technical referees to review papers submitted to the NI for publication in the Journal section of *Nuclear Future*. Also, Committee Members are expected to advise the Technical Editor on technical topic areas and possible sources of technical papers and articles.

Committee members are expected to actively promote opportunities to contribute to *Nuclear Future* within their organisations and networks. Once per year members are called upon to select the winner of the Pinkerton Prize winner for best technical paper.

- space applications of nuclear technologies
- the defence nuclear programme
- project management and the delivery of nuclear major projects

Experience of working in committees is welcome but not essential. Training and support will be provided.
